

DIXON FAMILY SERVICES AND THRIFT STORE HISTORY

Since 1984 our “one-stop-shop” of social services has been helping children, teens, families, seniors and individuals. Thousands of people are better off and many more have achieved goals such as sobriety, positive parenting skills, social and emotional wellness, self-esteem, escape from domestic violence, employment, financial stability and family cohesiveness. Many of these people are now active, productive and giving members of this community.

The Dixon Family Services Thrift Store was opened in October 2013 to provide a system for people to donate their unwanted and unneeded gently-used clothing, furniture and household items to be reused or repurposed by others at reasonable prices. Proceeds from the DFS Thrift Store are used to maintain itself and as a source of financial support for Dixon Family Services’ operations and programs.

The DFS Thrift Store is overseen by the DFS Thrift Store Committee, a Dixon Family Services Board of Directors program committee. Coordination, policy setting, store guidelines and oversight of all operations of the DFS Thrift Store are the responsibility of the Dixon Family Services Executive Director and the Thrift Store Committee.

The community has been supportive of Dixon Family Services since the beginning. Being a donor, volunteer or a customer of the Thrift Store are additional ways for people to support Dixon Family Services’ mission to improve lives in our community.
